

Welcome to all attendees, we have once again returned to a virtual AGM as this has proved more popular than a face-to-face meeting in that the number of members attending are greater, so we thank you for giving up your time this evening.

Writing this report, it hardly seems possible that another year has gone by since we came out of lock down due to Covid 19. I am delighted to be able to convey that as a region we thankfully have pretty much returned to pre-covid in most areas of participation. The hardest challenge for most of our members to return was due to facilities not all venues in the early part of return were available for participation. However, East Midland members showed their resilience and overcame all obstacles to return to the sport we all love.

On conclusion of the EN premiere league we currently have two teams in the league for next season, unfortunately, neither Bridgford nor TFC qualified from the play-offs. A special mention must go to following: Loughborough Lightning on winning the National Superleague 2023, Sponne School (Northant's) who won the England Mens & Mixed Netball (EMMNA) U16s schools' competition with Lutterworth High School (Leicestershire) taking the runners up place. 





# **COMPETITION TECHNICAL SUPPORT GROUP**

# Report loosely covers the playing period 30<sup>th</sup> May 2023 – 19<sup>th</sup> May 2024

The Competition TSG consists of the TSG Lead, the Regional League Secretary, the Junior League Secretary and up to two representative from each county carrying one vote per county.

The Competition TSG meets every other month to plan all aspects of competition including rules and regulations, procedures and protocols, budgets, eligibility, allocation of events and event management. We also appraise every event and implement changes to improve the quality of netball we provide at regional level.

Our aim is to provide a high level of competition, at a reasonable price, at quality venues and ultimately give teams a positive experience - win or lose, so I would like to thank all members of the Competition TSG and the numerous volunteers within the counties whose tireless work ensures that competition provided in the East Midlands is well organised and I hope appreciated.

Lynn and Ruth must be singled out for their season-long contribution and without them, there would be no leagues. We were sorry to lose Liz, Matt and Jackie whose contributions were invaluable.

We welcome all feedback, but unfortunately not all suggestions can be adopted as we are restricted by national regulations and limited by availability of indoor facilities, but we do take all comments on board and try to make competitions fair and equitable while providing a positive experience for all participants – players; team officials, umpires; spectators; bench officials and the rest of the volunteer work force.

Although the playing season starts in September, the preparation starts in January with booking facilities and producing the Competition Calendar. The availability of courts, national deadlines, Bank Holidays and clashes with other competitions and events are all factors we have to take into consideration when preparing the calendar which means it isn't always possible to avoid school holidays especially when the region's counties have different half terms. The calendar is usually ready for publication in July and will be available on the regional website.

We are very lucky to have the Sir David Wallace Sports Hall three-court indoor venue in addition to the two courts at the Netball Centre and the New Victory Hall, all at Loughborough University - all with excellent facilities and helpful staff, but we have to share these facilities with other sports and events as well as students, which means we don't always get the dates and times we would like. The only downside is the lack of space for participants during tournaments when they are not on court.

The Junior League moved to Ratcliffe College this season and has proved very popular. It is thankfully within reach of the University allowing team officials and spectators the opportunity to travel from the Regional League to the Junior League to support their teams in the afternoon.

We are hoping to include a second division for each age group if there is sufficient interest and fully expect most of the players to be U15 and U13. Teams will be offered places following the U16 & U14 Qualifying Tournaments

Entry into the Junior Leagues is through the Junior League Qualifying Tournaments for next season's Junior League are as follows and entry forms are available on the regional website.

U14 Junior League Qualifying Tournament will be on 16<sup>th</sup> June U16 Junior League Qualifying Tournament will be on 30<sup>d</sup> June

England Netball encouraged regions to adopt a Cup and Plate approach to the regional round of the National Schools Competition in 2023 to give a second opportunity of trophies and medals to those schools not qualifying for the play offs. This was repeated in 2024 and looks like to format going forward. Again the players enjoyed the excellent facilities at Oundle School which was also the venue for the National Finals.

We continue to be concerned about our junior clubs and schools teams and how they fair against stronger regions at U14, U16 and U19 national events. We discussed how competition could help improve the standard but feel it is a wider issue with such factors to consider as insufficient volunteers with an interest in junior netball and comparatively few clubs taking on junior sides. Links with schools could be improved and EN's decision to allow out of region players to join our county academies means our own home-grown players are missing out. We are also the second least populated region in the country after the North East which must have an effect on the number of young girls choosing netball as a sport.

Concern also continues about the increased number of commercial leagues and the impact they have on the availability of umpires, players and volunteers in regulated netball at all levels.

BUT, we will battle on and look forward to the challenges of another year and hope to serve the region well.

#### **Playing Opportunities**

There are regional competition opportunities available at every level. Some of the competitions are open entry and others require clubs to qualify through a county round.

<u>Schools U14s, U16s, U19s</u> - The top two in each age group from each county qualify for the Regional Finals which are held every February. The competition offers a Cup and Plate elements. The top two in the Cup competition in each age group from the Regional Finals go forward to the National Finals held annually in March.

<u>Bee Stingers</u> the successor to High 5's - Open entry for affiliated players Years 5 & 6- small clubs can combine players for the day - usually held in May

<u>Clubs U12s</u> - Open entry for affiliated players - small clubs can combine players for the day - usually held in May/June on a different day to the Clubs High 5's.

<u>Junior League (U14 and U16 sections)</u> –1 hour matches indoors at Ratcliffe College and the league ran between September and February. Entry into the league was via an open entry qualifying tournament. Next season, may include second divisions.

<u>National U14's and U16's Clubs Qualifying Tournaments</u>- The top two from each county qualify for the Regional Finals which are held each year held in March/April. They are one day tournaments held on separate days. The top two from the Regional Finals of each age group go forward to the National finals usually in April/May and are held over 2 days.

<u>Regional League Qualifying Tournament</u> - Up to two teams from each county compete alongside the bottom two teams from Division 3 to decide which teams will play in Div 3 the following season.

<u>Regional League</u> - Entry into the Regional League is via the Qualifying Tournament (above). The League is played on Sundays between September and April. Winners of Div 1 go forward to the National Play offs to compete for a place in the National Premier League. It is the intention that all matches are played indoors at Loughborough University.

# East Midlands Netball AGM 2024 Coaching TSG Report

The Regional Coaching TSG should consist of representatives from all counties and their role is to

- Identify appropriate coach education for coaches at all levels
- Take feedback from coaches / teachers in all environments as to their coach development needs
- Enable an appropriate coach mentoring programme across the 5 counties
- Educate teachers and coaches in the characteristics of a talented athlete
- Share good coaching practice across the region
- Alert coaches to the numerous coaching opportunities on the EN website
- Work with LL franchise to deliver coach specific workshops
- Understand the current landscape of qualified coaches in clubs against perceived need
- Identify what help is needed to develop netball in schools at all age-groups
- Support the process of identification and selection of players with potential

Unfortunately, we have not been able to address much of the above due to a lack of volunteers although we did organise a very successful Coaching Conference in June 2023. My thanks to all those who supported the event.

30 delegates attended a full day of inspirational delivery from a variety of deliverers including;

- Beth Jackson highlighting working with players with Neuro-diversity and hidden disabilities
- Kat Ratnapala and Chris Cushion from England netball
- Josie Pointon, Vick Burgess, Imogen Storey and Dylan Martins from LL franchise

The quality of delivery was exceptional and all attendees left with a greater understanding of so many aspects of good coaching practice that they were keen to deliver in their own environments.

The Coaching TSG has not met since and no-one has come forward to replace me as Chair of the group. Nottinghamshire, Derbyshire, Lincolnshire and Northants do not appear to have a Coaching Lead at the moment but Andrea Scigliano from Leicestershire has provided an update on the support that she has given to the clubs in the county.

Coaches are continuing to attend Level 1 and level 2 coaching courses and the Region has supported many coaches with grants of up to 50%

Furthermore, within my clubs, we have appropriate, trained and clearly identified safeguarding officers on our committee and at all training and matches involving young players. This has enabled us to spot players that may be struggling (often nothing to do with netball) and support them within safeguarding guidelines.

Inclusion is an interesting challenge for a proudly female-led sport, and one that we have to address if we are to be truly inclusive of gender (both birth gender and gender identity). At the national and World Netball level, I have followed the current debates on gender and follow the decisions being made by different national governing bodies and am interested to see where they land this summer. On a more practical level, clubs and the region have decisions to make about where the fast-growing men's and mixed game sits in the landscape and navigate the tradition female-only profile of the sport alongside the emerging forms of the game.

Understanding and experience of voluntary sports organisations and the relationship between voluntary and paid staff

I have extensive experience of working with volunteers and managing the relationship between paid and voluntary staff. Between 2011-2014 I led a heritage and regeneration charity, The Auckland Project (<u>Home</u> <u>The Auckland Project</u>), and the associated community volunteer spectacular 'Kynren' (<u>Kynren | An Epic</u>

<u>Tale of England (11arches.com)</u>), which relied upon over 3000 volunteers for its success. I am clear that whilst being respectful of the time and other commitments of volunteers, it is critical to train and support volunteers just as one would paid members of staff. This includes definition of roles, responsibilities and accountabilities, volunteer oversight and management, safeguarding training, governance, financial accountability, data management etc. This ensures that the organisation and its staff and volunteers are appropriately protected and risk managed, as well as creating an environment for success and flourishing.

Within netball, I have been involved with sports organisations as a volunteer and as a manager of other volunteers. Starting when I was at university, I was captain and secretary of Cambridge University Netball Club and the Combined Universities team, and Secretary of the Varsity Games Committee. This commitment to organisation and administration has continued throughout my adult life.

I am currently undertaking the following voluntary committee and leadership roles:

- Chair: Moll Buzzers Netball Club (Loughborough). First team captain, coach, umpire.
- Committee Member: TFC Netball Club (Leicester), responsibility for safeguarding. First team captain, coach, selector, pathway development and parental communication.
- Committee Member: Loughborough Town Netball League (2022/3 winner: LTNL Umpire of the Year)

Moll Buzzers is also committed to supporting our U18 members in volunteering as officials and event organisers, connecting with England Netball's 'Pass on your Passion' initiative. Our young players volunteer at national men's and mixed tournaments as tournament runners and camera operators for live streams, and play an important officiating roles at local and regional league games.

## A passion for the development of sport

My real passion is for supporting state school girls to develop a love of netball and pursue their talent as far as it can take them. I am extremely proud of the burgeoning partnerships that Moll Buzzers and TFC have with both Charnwood College and Loughborough College, giving girls the opportunity to access high quality coaching and advice about how they can develop as players within their communities, and stage-appropriate match play in a supported environment. The club also supports young players to develop their umpiring and coaching skills, and take on volunteer officiating and committee roles, equipping them with skills for life as well as for sport.

Over the last 8 years, Moll Buzzers has rebuilt from barely 1 team to a thriving club of 4 women's teams, a connection with Deaf Netball and for the first time, a mixed team entered into Mixed Nationals, to be held at Loughborough University in August 2024. I am passionate about the importance of a netball as a female-led sport, as well as recognising that to be fully inclusive and assure a financially viable future, we have to embrace all forms of the game.

At regional level with TFC, we have benefitted from male training partners challenging our preconceptions about the sport and its structures and norms, and I love learning new ideas and gaining new insights.

Knowledge, understanding and experience of England Netball's vision and strategic plan, systems and structures and their wider national and regional policies and opportunities for the development of the sport

I have a good understanding of England Netball's strategic and policy environment, and will just pick out a small number of aspects in which I am particularly interested or where I believe there is further scope for development.

First, I think the region has an important role to play in the NetballHER strategy, particularly in terms of improving the understanding of how the sport impacts on the female body and steps that we need to take to manage this. These discussions are not dissimilar to past discussions in Rugby about changing the scrummaging and tackling rules to address head injury risk – netball needs to consider the root cause of the disproportionate number of female athletes being affected by ACL/MCL/Ankle injuries, as well as better understanding the management of physical wellbeing through the development and aging of the female body. With Loughborough University as a leading sporting institution at the heart of the region, there is plenty of scope for the region to be a leading voice in responding to this priority.

Second, reflecting on England Netball's strategic aim of creating a lifelong love of the sport, I am interested in championing the creation of elite pathways for older players ('Masters series'), noting that comparable sports such as basketball, hockey, athletics and cricket maintain competitive pathways for women and men of all ages, rather than defaulting for older players to the more inclusion-driven forms of the game (e.g. walking netball). Whilst these are important, competitive Masters programmes are a legitimate aspect of elite sport, and could potentially be a revenue stream, as well as locking in players to sport and club leadership roles who would otherwise leave netball once their pre-veteran competitive years end.

Third, I am interested in the role that the region will play as England Netball delivers on its objective for the sport to be fully professional under new franchises. The complexity between professional/franchise structures and the regional and local competition seems an important area for further development nationally, and I would be interested in being a part of this.
